*Personal pronouns can be joined with
some verbs to form contractions

Pronoun + verb = contraction

*An apostrophe replaces any missing
letters

- I + am = I'm
- you + are = you're
- we + are = we're

- they + are= they're
- he + is/has=he's
- it + is/has= it's
- I + have= I've
- you + have= you've
- we + have= we've
- they + have= they've
- She + is/has= she's
- I + will= I'll
- you + will= you'll
- She + will= she'll

- He + will= he'll
- It + will= it'll
- we + will= we'll
- they + will= they'll
