\*An adjective usually comes **before the noun**.

\*An adjective that follows a **linking verb** and describes or explains the **subject (noun)** is also called a **subject complement**, which can also act as an **adjective**.

\*Some common **linking verbs** are: am, is, **are**, was, were, appear, be, become, feel, felt, grow, look, remain, seem, smell, sound, stay, and taste
