A pronoun takes the place of a noun. Pronouns help avoid repetition of the same word. A SINGULAR pronoun refers to ONE person, place, or thing. A PLURAL pronoun refers to more than one person, place, or thing.

Singular	Plural
I, me, mine	we, us, ours
you, yours	you, yours
he, him, his,	they
she, her, hers,	them
it, its	theirs

Caleb and James like playing football.
